

2025 Updates

In 2025, Michigan State University enhanced the Counseling & Mental Health Services reimbursement program by providing clarification on what services are eligible for reimbursement for the spouses and/or parent/legal guardians of MSU survivors, and expanded coverage for children of survivors. These changes were a result of feedback received from survivors.

MSU provided clarification on eligible services for children, spouses and/or parents/legal guardians of survivors:

- Children, spouses and/or parents/legal guardians of survivors with insurance will supply a copy of the Explanation of Benefits (EOB) from all insurance companies that covered outpatient services, along with a completed Reimbursement Form.
- Children, spouses and/or parents/legal guardians of survivors who do not have insurance will supply a paid invoice or superbill from the mental health provider or primary care physician, along with a completed Reimbursement Form.

MSU expanded coverage to include the children of survivors:

- Children of survivors (biological, adopted and/or step-children) are eligible to receive reimbursement for approved outpatient mental health services, as detailed below.
 - Outpatient counseling and mental health services (including telehealth);
 - Group therapy, which is applicable to individuals with or without insurance coverage and who are related to a survivor.
