

## Diagnoses

Requests for reimbursement must be presented with a behavioral health diagnosis.

### Eligible Diagnoses

<u>ICD-10 Diagnosis Categories</u>	<u>Description</u>
<b>F20 - F29</b>	Schizophrenia, schizotypal, delusional, and other non-mood psychotic disorders
<b>F30 - F39</b>	Mood (affective disorders)
<b>F40 - F48</b>	Anxiety, dissociative, stress-related, somatoform & other nonpsychotic mental disorders
<b>F50</b>	Eating disorders
<b>F52</b>	Sexual dysfunction not due to a substance or known physiological condition
<b>F53</b>	Mental & behavioral disorders associated with the puerperium, not elsewhere classified
<b>F54</b>	Psychological & behavioral factors associated with disorders or diseases classified elsewhere
<b>F55</b>	Abuse of non-psychoactive substances
<b>F59</b>	Unspecified behavioral syndromes associated with physiological disturbances & physical factors
<b>F60 - F69</b>	Disorders of adult personality & behavior
<b>F88</b>	Other disorders of psychological development
<b>F89</b>	Unspecified disorder of psychological development
<b>F91</b>	Conduct disorders
<b>F93</b>	Emotional disorders with onset specific to childhood
<b>F94</b>	Disorders of social functioning with onset specific to childhood & adolescence
<b>F99</b>	Unspecified mental disorder

Many ICD-10 diagnosis codes in the F01-F99 range are considered eligible for reimbursement under the Fund, with the **exception** of those listed below:

### Diagnoses NOT ELIGIBLE for Reimbursement

<u>ICD-10 Diagnosis Categories</u>	<u>Description</u>
<b>F01 - F09</b>	Mental disorders due to known physiological conditions
<b>F10 - F19</b>	Mental & behavioral disorders due to psychoactive substance abuse
<b>F51</b>	Behavioral syndromes associated with physiological disturbances & physical factors (limited to these codes)
<b>F70 – F79</b>	Intellectual disabilities
<b>F80 – F84</b>	Pervasive & specific development disorders (limited to these codes)
<b>F90</b>	Attention-deficit hyperactivity disorders
<b>F95 – F98</b>	Behavioral & emotional disorders with onset usually occurring in childhood & adolescence (limited to these codes)
